Her death was ruled a suicide.

Autumn, 1949: A 22-year-old nursemaid's body was found.
Her death was ruled a homicide.

Ralph Jennings, of Gonic, NH, was tried for the nursemaid's murder, found guilty, and sentenced to be hanged July 5, 1950.
That never occurred.
